Use these questions in your Community Group, GROWth Groups, with your family or your friends to give you practical ways to walk out today's message.

What narratives about God do I believe that are false? Ideas like:

- "God wants me to try harder." NOT TRUE!
- "God blesses me when I'm good and punishes me when I'm bad." NOT TRUE!
- "God is angry with me." NOT TRUE!

How do I currently view God?

Is what Jesus reveals about God in alignment or contradiction what I think about God.

Which one of the 6 Bible Study Methods could I implement this week?

What "revelations" have I discovered in the Bible that have changed how I view God?

Six Bible Study Methods

- 1. EXPOSITORY: studying in depth verse by verse, using observation, interpretation, and application.
- 2. SURVEY: studying general information about the author and audience, dates, location, themes, writing styles, etc.
- 3. TOPICAL: studying topics we're interested in like marriage, family, finances, prophecy, etc.
- 4. BIOGRAPHICAL: studying the character and life of one of the 2900+ people mentioned in the Bible.
- 5. WORD STUDY: studying specific words like Hallelujah, Hosanna, Messiah, and Christ, or phrases like spiritual gifts.
- 6. DEVOTIONAL: studying in preparation to meet each day with confidence of God's presence throughout the day.
