Read this quote two times through and meditate on what it means to have a lifestyle of worship.

If a lifestyle of worship is left to the mercy of spontaneity, then what should be usual will become occasional. Feelings, emotions and experiences, whether good, bad or ugly, will drive our agenda, reducing our worship to unpremeditated expressions that create a spiritual high for us, but little else. An extravagant worship-lifestyle, however, doesn't need any excuse because it has found its cause. It's not random, it flows out of revelation. It replaces the occasional with the intentional.

YouVersion—Extravagant: when worship becomes lifestyle
